It was a delight to host Raewyn Stone and Pāora Puru from the Trust at the launch of both the research report and the revamped Te Rito Toi site. The research report *Seeding Possibilities with the Arts* is available on <u>Te Rito Toi website</u>.

The research we undertook in 8 schools provide us with a rich understanding of the manner in which Te Rito Toi was used last year after lockdowns and also how it might be used post any crisis. We are delighted that the Associate Minister of Education, the Honourable Jan Tinetti has followed up her public commitment at the launch to progress this work and we look forward to a further meeting with her this month.

The changes to the site based on our research has strengthened and enriched the possibilities for teachers to engage with wellbeing and the arts post crisis. We were happy to also work with Chelmer Limited who helped with some budget shortfall with our video production work. We have been successful in disseminating the research through academic channels, with one article already published and a further two in review. Te Rito Toi has been further highlighted in the Education Gazette, the Ako Journal, and will feature in an extended interview on Radio New Zealand "Nine to Noon" on August 23rd.

Thank you so much for partnering with us on this project. We believe the work we have done will make significant differences to schools post crisis.
